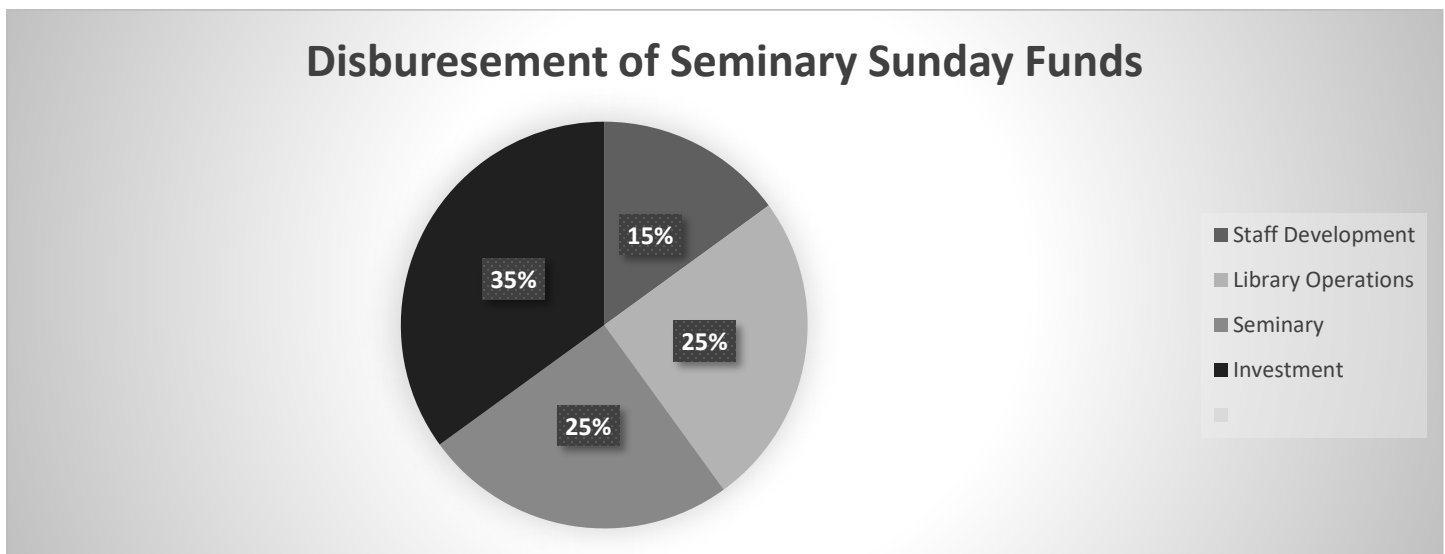


The salaries for all seminary employees are paid by the Congregational Christian Church of American Samoa through her annual financial contribution and donations.
